

**UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY

MONTHLY SUMMARY REPORT**

AUGUST 15, 2008

This monthly summary report (MSR) summarizes environmental site investigation and remediation activities conducted on behalf of The Regents of the University of California (UC) at the University of California, Berkeley's Richmond Field Station in accordance with Section 6.3 of the California Environmental Protection Agency, Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) Site Investigation and Remediation Order (Order), Docket No. I/SE-RAO 06/07-004, effective on September 20, 2006.

- a. Specific actions taken by or on behalf of Respondents during the previous calendar month (July 2008).
 - Implementation of invasive plant control continued as required by the Invasive/Exotic Vegetation Management Program.
 - University staff met with DTSC staff on July 11, 2008 to discuss revisions of the draft Current Conditions Report based on DTSC's comments.
- b. Actions expected to be undertaken during the current calendar month (August 2008).
 - Implementation of invasive plant control will continue as required by the Invasive/Exotic Vegetation Management Program.
- c. All planned activities for the next month (September 2008).
 - University staff will meet with DTSC staff on September 5, 2008 to discuss revisions of the draft Current Conditions Report based on DTSC's comments.
 - Implementation of invasive plant control will continue as required by the Invasive/Exotic Vegetation Management Program.
 - Feral animal trapping will occur as required by the Feral Animal Management Program.
 - It is anticipated that the Year 3 Monitoring Report for the Western Stege Marsh Restoration Project will be completed and submitted to DTSC.
 - A request to complete a Time Critical Removal Action for removing ash and debris from two small campfire pits located in the Western Transition Area is pending approval from DTSC and may be completed in September 2008.
