The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) received the Response to Comments and revised *Monitoring Well Installation Work Plan, Area 1, University of California Richmond Field Station (Work Plan)*, dated October 11, 2013. The Work Plan was revised in response to comments provided by DTSC in a letter dated September 18, 2013. The Response to Comments and revised Work Plan were prepared by Terraphase Engineering Inc. (Terraphase) on behalf of Zeneca Inc. and describes the procedures to install groundwater monitoring wells at the University of California (UC) Richmond Field Station (RFS) located in Richmond, California. The Work Plan includes installation of five groundwater monitoring wells in the shallow groundwater zone upgradient and downgradient of the biologically active permeable barrier (BAPB) in order to assess the performance of the BAPB. The data collected at these monitoring wells and data that will be collected by UC to the west of the BAPB will be used to evaluate whether additional groundwater remedial activities are needed in this area of the RFS. DTSC has reviewed the Response to Comments and the revised Work Plan and finds the responses adequately address our comments; however, Table 1 of the Work Plan was not revised as per response number 4. Therefore, the Work Plan is approved with the modification to Table 1 that the monitoring wells will be sampled on a quarterly basis. Please provide a revised Table 1 within 7 days of the date of this letter. As this modification does not impact the installation of the monitoring wells, implementation of the Work Plan may begin on October 17, 2013.
