

NRLF Phase 4 Construction: Freight Bill Annotations

All soil excavated as part of the NRLF Phase 4 construction was off hauled to the Alameda Golf Course in Alameda, CA. All soil imported for the project was from Baylands Soil Processing in Brisbane, CA. No soil was taken from the RFS to Baylands. Corrections and clarifications to the truck freight bills are provided below.

June 5, 2019: Several trucks were used to haul soil from the RFS to the Alameda Golf Course, and then directed to the Baylands Soil Processing in Brisbane, CA to pick up clean fill before returning to the RFS. Upon return to the RFS and unloading fill, the truck was reloaded with soil and the route repeated if time allowed. This indicated on the following freight bills:

Freight Bill 211202: Baylands Soil Processing is incorrectly listed as the receiving site for soil from the RFS. See enclosed communication with Baylands Soil Processing and S&S Trucking clarifying that soil was not received at Baylands Soil Processing on June 5, 2019. This truck drove the route described above: hauling soil from the RFS to the Golf Course, then picking up clean fill at Baylands before returning to the RFS and repeating the circuit.

Freight Bill 216712: The first load indicated on the tag is of excess cellular concrete from the building slab construction delivered to Syar in Vallejo, CA for recycling. Upon return to the RFS, the truck was loaded with soil to be hauled to the Golf Course.

Freight Bill 58809: Destination is blank on freight bill. See enclosed communication with Jass Boys dispatch confirming destination of truck was the Alameda Golf Course.
